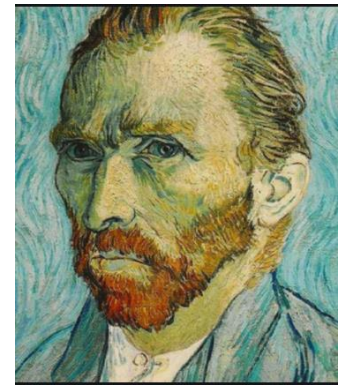

<u>Key Knowledge</u>
Vincent van Gogh was born in Zundert in the Netherlands, on 30 th March 1853.
Van Gogh was a Post-Impressionist artist.
Post-Impressionism is a style of art that uses real-life situations, vivid colours (that don't always match the colour of something in real life) and thick paint.
Van Gogh had a varied career, including working as an art dealer, a teaching assistant and a lay-preacher (an unofficial vicar).
Vincent van Gogh left over 850 paintings, having only sold one during his lifetime.
His most famous works include The Potato Eaters (1885), Sunflowers (1887) and Portrait of Dr Gachet (1890).
Starry Night is one of Vincent's most admired painting. It was painted on canvas using oil paints.
The painting is Vincent's impression of the view from his hospital room.
