Year Five Learning Letter

Spring Term

This term our topic will be about The Great War. We will start by looking at how it all began and then move onto how the conflict affected different groups of people.

In Art we will be making 3D sculptures. Specifically, we will be designing dioramas based on war memorials.

In **DT** we will be cooking! We will follow some wartime recipes.



In **English** we will be focusing on the story 'The Lost Happy Endings' by Carol Ann Duffy. Throughout the term, we will focus on narrative, poetry, instructional writing and information texts as well as completing extended writing within our topic work. We will continue to develop our spelling, punctuation and grammar, with a particular focus on the use of parenthesis, modal verbs, cohesion and relative clauses.



In Maths we will be working on our general number sense as well as shapes and graphs. We will continue to look at strategies for the four operations of number. This term we will also learn about angles and shape properties. As always, mental maths is very important and we will continue to work on our times tables and other basic skills. In our **History** lessons, we will be studying The Great War. How did it begin? What was life like for men, women and children at home and on the front line? How did the British Government use propaganda as a tool to motive the nation? And finally, who were significant figures during this famous conflict? The **Geography** work we will undertake will involve locating on a map the main countries involved in The Great War and learning about their landscape features.

PE

This term we will be fortunate enough to have a coach in for Dance and we will continue to go swimming on Thursdays.



In **Computing** we will be using Movie-Maker to design adverts and 'news style' videos based on World War One. We will also be learning about how the Internet works by following the route a packet of information takes. In **RE** we will be studying Judaism and Christianity. In Judaism we will be looking at synagogues, Moses, The Torah and beliefs. Specifically we will look at the life of Jesus Christ. Through reading parables we will learn about what he taught people. We will also learn about the key events of his life.

In French we will be looking at celebrations and portraits. We will also look at the use of verbs and continue looking at having conversations.

In Music we will continue to work with the wider opportunities team to learn how to play our instruments, how to improve our singing and how to read music.
