## 'Conflict'



Year Six Learning Leaflet

Spring Term

This term our topic will be about The Great War. We will start by looking at how it all began and then move onto how the conflict impacted different groups of people.

In **Art** we will be making 3D sculptures. Specifically, we will be designing dioramas based on war memorials.

In **DT** we will be cooking! We will follow some wartime recipes.



Within **English**, we will continue to develop our spelling, punctuation and grammar, looking specifically at our use of vocabulary and punctuation and the result this has on the overall piece of writing. For the first half term, we will be focusing our writing around the text *Finding Winnie* by Lindsay Mattick, looking at biographical writing and then after half term we will look at *The Island* by Armin Greder with a focus on narrative.

In **Maths**, we will finish looking at fractions, decimals and percentages before moving on to look at geometry with a specific focus on position and direction. After half term, we will look at measurement, properties of shape and ratio. Across these units, we will continue to develop our problem solving and reasoning skills.

In **Computing** we will be developing our researching skills and looking at ways to present information. After half term, we will be using Movie-Maker to present videos on World War One.

We will continue to work on our conversational skills in **French** and will be led through our learning by a French specialist.

#### PE

This term we will be focusing on netball and health and fitness with Miss Preugschat. We will also be brushing up on our cricket skills with our external coach.

In our **History** lessons, we will be studying The Great War. Specifically looking at: how it began; what life was like for men, women and children at home and on the front line; how the British Government used propaganda as a tool to motivate the nation; and finally, who the significant figures were during this famous conflict. The **Geography** work we will undertake will involve locating on a map the main countries involved in The Great War and learning about their landscape features.



In **Music** we will be working with Miss Parr, our music specialist associate teacher, creating pieces to be played alongside wartime videos.

In **RE** we will be studying Christianity, specifically looking at the ten commandments and their influence on Christian believers.
