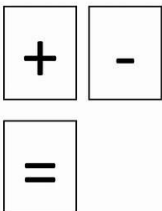
Journeys – near and far!

Journeys – near and far! is a topic based on our geographical location. The children will learn about their locality as well as other countries and oceans across the world. We will focus on books which highlight characters' journeys.

In **computing** we will be using the app 'Pic Collage' to create a collage relating to our topic. We are learning about how to use technology safely. Children will learn how to visit safe sites and search for information. We will also focus on simple coding.



In **English** we will be focusing on handwriting and letter formation to begin with. We will be using Pathways to Write and will focus on the story Lost and Found by Oliver Jeffers. The children will be getting used to using capital letters and full stops in a sentence. The children will be encouraged to participate in discussions and listen and respond to build on vocabulary. We will have a focus on using capital letters for names and using the personal pronoun 'I'. We will then move onto the story Nibble the Book Monster. In this unit, we will be using 'and' to join words. We will also focus on using the plural noun suffixes -s and -es. We will be sequencing sentences to form short narratives.



In **Maths** we will be reading and writing numbers to 10 and identifying one more and one less. We will be counting forwards and backwards from any number. We will be looking at number and place value within 20. We will also cover addition and subtraction within 10. We will move onto Geometry and identify 2D and 3D shapes. We will learn to read, write and interpret mathematical statements involving + - and = signs. We will learn to count in 2s, 5s and 10s.

In **Geography** we will be identifying seasonal and daily weather patterns in the UK and the location of hot and cold areas of the world in relation to the Equator and the North and South Poles. We will use basic geographical vocabulary to refer to key human features, including: city, town, village, factory, farm, house, office and shop.

In **History** we will learn about Changes within living memory. We will focus on how stories have changed over time. We will be asking parents and grandparents what their favourite stories are.



In **R.E** we will be learning Christianity. We will evaluate what it means to Christians to belong to a church. We will identify key aspects of the Christmas story and explain why Jesus was good news for Christians. We will listen and respond to well-known bible stories.

In **P.E** we will develop the following fundamental skills: agility, coordination, throwing, catching, kicking and striking. We will take part in individual, partner and team games and challenges. We will develop our tactical awareness.

In **Music** we will explore different instruments. We will be singing and learning simple songs. We will be taking part in our Christmas production.



In **Art** we will focus on artists such as Kandinsky and Hunderwasser. We will create our own fairytale collage using colour, pattern, texture, line, shape, form and space.

In **DT** we will design and make a sandwich for a journey to the South Pole. We will also build structures and investigate how they can be made stronger, stiffer and more stable.

In **Science** we will name and distinguish between an object and the material from which it is made. We will describe the simple physical properties of a variety of everyday materials. Following this, we will identify and name a variety of common wild and garden plants, including deciduous and evergreen trees. We will identify and describe the basic structure of a variety of common flowering plants, including trees.
