How do Muslims worship?

Key Knowledge.

. Muslims believe that angels or Malaikah were created before humans with the purpose of following the orders of Allah and communicating with humans. They were made from a special kind of light. Angels are immortal. They are pure and cannot sin. They obey and serve Allah at all times.

. Muhammad was alive over 1500 years ago and Muslims believe that he was the last Prophet sent by Allah.


. Prophet Muhammed was meditating in a cave on Mount Hira, when the Angel Jibril came to him and asked him to recite the Qur'an. Muhammad went to the cave alone, for one month each year, which continued for 23yrs to meditate.

. Muslims worship (pray), in a Mosque. Muslims can visit the temple any time of the day and also can pray at home.

Key Vocabulary	Definition
Prophet	Special messengers who deliver messages from Allah.
Revelation	Revelation involves the 'revealing' of truth and for Muslims, the Qur'an is the most important source of revelation.
Qur'an	The Islamic sacred book, believed to be the word of God as dictated to Muhammad
Respect	A feeling of deep admiration for someone or something elicited by their abilities, qualities, or achievements.
5 fingers	Islam, Muslim, Qur'an, Arabic, Mosque and Allah
Mosque	A Muslim place of worship.
Wudu	A purification ritual, where Muslims are required to wash their faces, hands, arms and feet before prayer.

Our End Points:

Emerging: Can I explain that Muhammad (pbuh) was a prophet and that Muslims believe in other messengers called angels.

Expected: Pupils can explain the importance of the Qur'an for Muslims and can tell you about how Muslims worship in a Mosque and in day to day lives.

Exceeding: Can give a range of examples of how Muslims show obedience and respect to Allah through worship which could be through the reading of the Qur'an, prayer, art etc..
