## E-Safety

E-Safety at a simple level means being safe on the internet. Some people also include the safe use of technology in this as well.



## Clickbait

Clickbait is a text or link that is designed to attract attention. It is trying to tempt the online user to click, read, view or listen to the content. Sometimes these clickbait links are not always honest news and can take you to third party websites which are inappropriate or are trying to gain personal information.

Media balance	using media in a way that feels healthy and in balance with other life activities (family, friends, school, hobbies, etc.)
Gender stereotypes	oversimplified ideas about how women and men are or should be
Clickbait	an image or headline that tries to get you to click on it, usually for advertising purposes
Private information	information about you that can be used to identify you because it is unique to you (e.g. your full name or your address)
Cyberbullying	using digital devices, sites, and apps to intimidate, harm, and upset someone
Bystander	someone who sees a bullying or cyberbullying situation, but doesn't? do anything to stop it
Upstander	a person who supports and stands up for someone else
Phishing	The attempt to gain private information illegally

## How to stay safe on the internet

- 1. Create complex passwords.
- 2. Do not talk to anybody you do not know.
- 3. Do not give out any private information name, address, age, bank information etc.
- 4. Make sure you share with a trusted adult what you are doing online and talk to somebody if you are worried.
- 5. If you see something that upsets you online or is upsetting somebody else, report this to a trusted adult.
