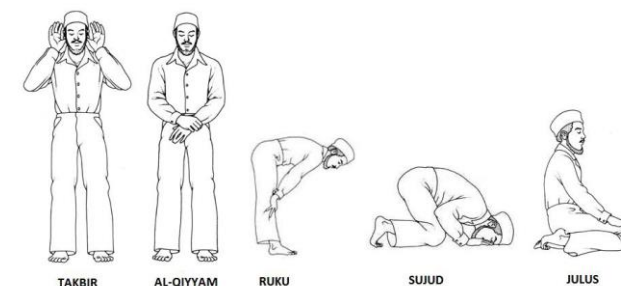


Key Artefacts and Symbols



Salah

Muslims bow down to Allah in scheduled prayers. It is the second Pillar of Islam. For Muslims, God is worth worshipping, submitting to and praying to. Muslim carrying out these prayers will perform a whole series of set movements that go with the words of the prayer. (As seen in the picture)



Our End Points:

Emerging: Can explain that Muhammad (pbuh) was a prophet and that Muslims believe in other messengers called Angels.

Expected: Pupils can explain the importance of the Qur'an for Muslims and can tell you about how Muslims worship in a Mosque and in day to day lives.

Exceeding: Can give a range of examples of how Muslims show obedience and respect to Allah through worship which could be through the reading of the Qur'an, prayer, art etc.
