Think about:

## Creature feature

Select an animal that lives in Africa. Do some research online and make some notes about your chosen creature. Think about dividing your notes into sections, such as appearance, habitat, diet. San Diego Zoo have a great website you might want to use.



Write a **non-chronological report** (information text) about your animal. Think about:

- What sections you need to have
- How you are going to set it out
- How you are going to make your information interesting to read

## Puzzling plants

Select a plant that is found in Africa. Do some research online and make some notes about your chosen plant. Think about dividing your notes into sections, such as appearance, habitat. San Diego Zoo have a great website you might want to use.



Create an information poster about your plant to be displayed in a zoo where it is kept. Think about:

- What sections you need to have
- How you are going to set it out
- How you are going to make your information interesting to read

Look at the image. If you were there, what could you see?

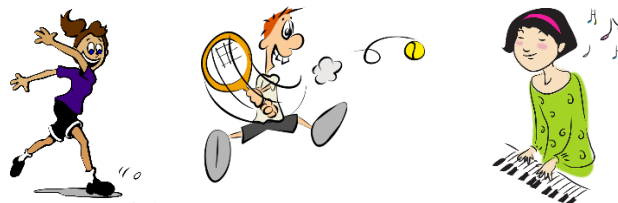
Write a **description** that tells your reader about the place.
