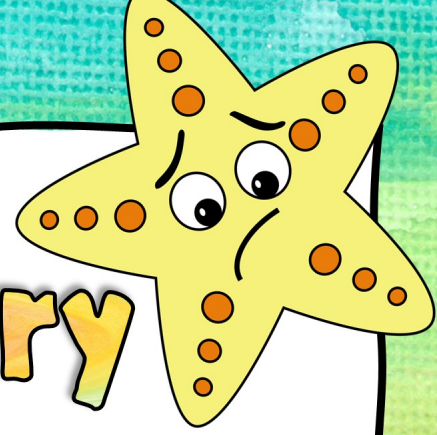
The Starfish story is a lovely story to read to children. It is about making a difference. It can be the smallest thing but it can make a difference.

Starfish Story



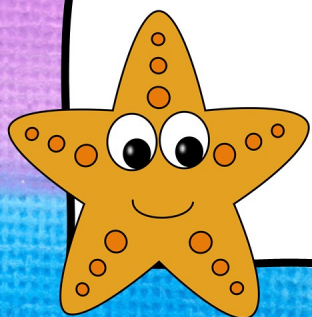

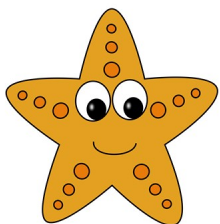


